

LTED and Coaching 2011

This is a chart showing the correspondence of the new coaching certificates to LTED stages. The model is a framework, and there is actually more overlap than is shown. For example, while a High Performance (old Level 3) coach will be specialized with athletes at the Learning and Training to Win stage (national/international competition), they will likely have a bulk of their clientele in the Learn to Compete stage- Silver competitors who have selected a High Performance coach to help them develop to a higher competitive level.

This chart is now printed on the back inside cover of the LTED manual, and is posted on the Equine Canada website. The message is that the coaching levels specialize in development of athletes in a range of stages, not that they are restricted to teaching only certain levels.

You will also notice the parallel track between Competition Coach and the Instructor stream. In the past, coach certification was viewed as an upgrade from Instructor certification. Under the new NCCP, both a coach and instructor might be working with beginner to intermediate riders. The difference is the context: coaches work with competitive clients, and Instructors would be working with largely non-competitive clientele.

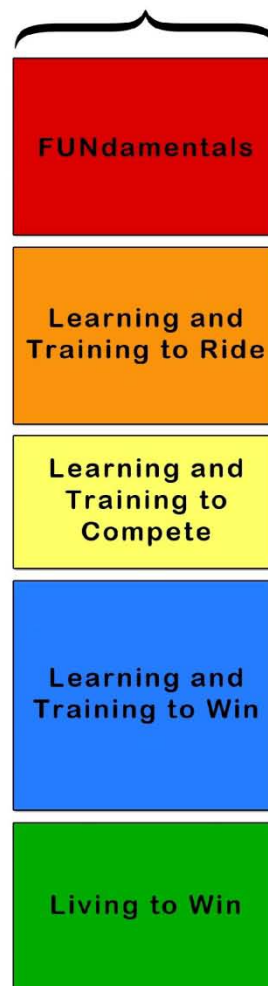

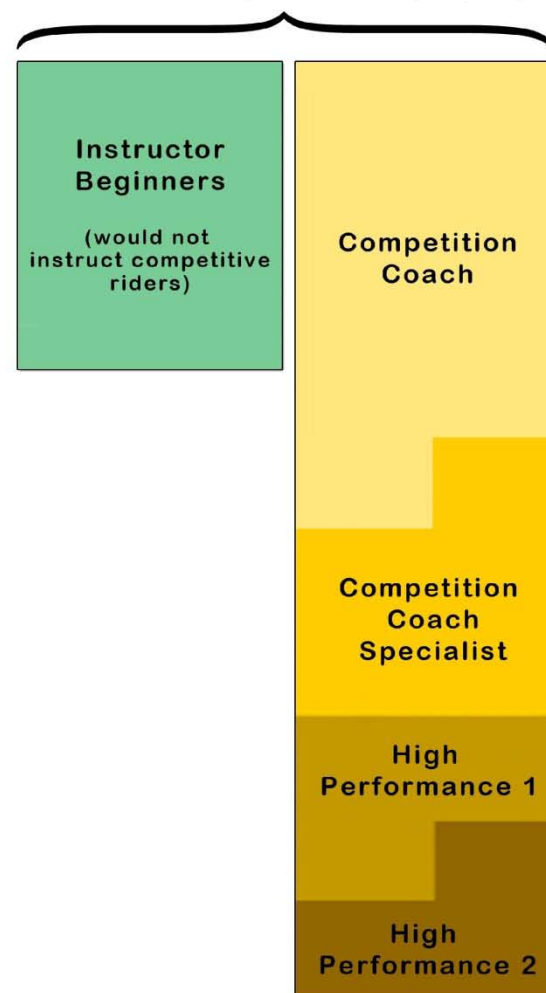
