Equine Canada – Provincial Coaching Committees

Each province has a Coaching Committee responsible for the administration and funding of the Level 1 and 2 Coaching programs within their province. The composition of the committee is at the discretion of the province. Two individuals are selected from each province – one as a Technical representative (Master Course Conductor), one as an Administrative representative (Provincial Coordinator) – to represent the province at the National Committee.

Responsibilities

- Disseminate information to Coaches and Course Conductors within the province
- Administer and promote the Coach 1 and 2 programs within the province
- Organize updating seminars for provincial Coaches and Course Conductors
- Act as a provincial disciplinary committee
- Review, select and approve – from applications submitted to the committee no later than November 1st – those to be recommended for Course Conductor status to the National Coaching Committee at their annual meeting.

The structure and voting procedures for Provincial Coaching Committees are up to each province to determine. Provincial Coaching Committees may not make changes to the coaching programs.

At a minimum, the Western Provincial Coaching Committee is comprised of Master Course Conductor, Provincial Coordinator and Course Conductors. The Committee may include Coaches within the Province.

Nova Scotia Western Coaching Committees Responsibilities

- To include all responsibilities set out above by Equine Canada as seen in the Policies and Procedures manual
- To review and discuss any written complaints, concerns, etc that are submitted to the Provincial Coaching Committee, Master Course Conductor, or the Provincial Sport Office and advise on such matters
- To promote the Coaching program within the province
- To bring forward pertinent information and recommendations to the general coaching body at the annual coaching update, or throughout the year if necessary
- To recommend concerns, etc to be forwarded to the annual national meeting

Committee to be made up of Master Course Conductor, Provincial Coordinator, and all Course Conductors in the province, plus 4 Coaches, who will be nominated at each update, to sit on the committee for one year.
